WHITE APPOINTS SORROW AS CIVILIAN AIDE TO THE SECRETARY OF THE ARMY FOR WISCONSIN

MILWAUKEE -- Mr. Jerry Sorrow was formally recognized as the Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army (CASA) for Wisconsin on December 12, 2002 at his investiture ceremony held at the University Club in Milwaukee. Mr. Sorrow was appointed to this prominent role in February 2002 by the Secretary of the Army, Thomas E. White.

Mr. Sorrow retired in 2001 as President and Chief Executive Officer of BG Western, a Milwaukee-based manufacturer. During his career, he also served as President or General Manager of several international subsidiaries of Invensys, United Technologies -- Otis Elevator and Standard Motor Products.

Mr. Sorrow received a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering from the United States Military Academy, West Point, New York; a Master of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering and the Mechanical Engineer Degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Massachusetts; and studied for a Master of Business Administration at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Mr. Sorrow served on active duty for eight years in the United States Army in the Corps of Engineers. His military assignments included serving as an Assistant Professor of Thermodynamics, United States Military Academy, West Point; Manager, Metrology Laboratory Night Vision Laboratory, Fort Belvoir, Virginia; Company Commander, (Mobile Brigade), 24th Engineer Battalion, Nuremberg, Germany; and Platoon Leader, Atomic Demolition Munitions, 24th Engineer Battalion, Nuremberg, Germany.

His awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, and the Army Commendation Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster.
