Open communication is essential to a positive command climate. I have continually said that I am less concerned about "how" I receive information (concerns, feedback, input/ ideas, or reports of misconduct) and more concerned about open communication, learning, improving, fixing problems, and identifying and correcting misbehavior or misperceptions. Every Commander, from Company Commander to CG, USAREC, has an Open Door Policy. See the 2nd Brigade Policy attached. When Soldiers or Civilians choose to use an Open Door Policy, subordinate Commander's and leaders must ensure expedient and full access to the requested Commander.

DO NOT inhibit or prevent access to a Commander. While I have tremendous confidence in our chain of command, I am fully comfortable meeting with any member of our team. Additionally, I am fully comfortable with any member of our team meeting or speaking with our Commanding General. Every individual has their own reasons for how, when, and why they choose to use a Commander's Open Door Policy and we all need to respect and support that decision.
