





**Important System Update Message!**

As part of our ongoing NetTrainer maintenance efforts, we recently had to clear the registration system of over 2,000 duplicate accounts.

Duplicate registrations occur when users register for an account, then register again for another account. Obviously, this causes confusion for the user and for resolving technical support issues.

In order to resolve this issue, we have consolidated all duplicate account information into a single account for each user. In some cases, this may mean that you will need to use different login information depending on which account you use and which was consolidated.

If you cannot login to the system, please be sure to request your login information via the ["Forgot Your Password? Having trouble logging in?"](#) link below the "Login" button on the ["Log In"](#) screen.

**Please note that if you register for more than one account, the system will automatically disable the earlier account as we can only allow one account per person!**






